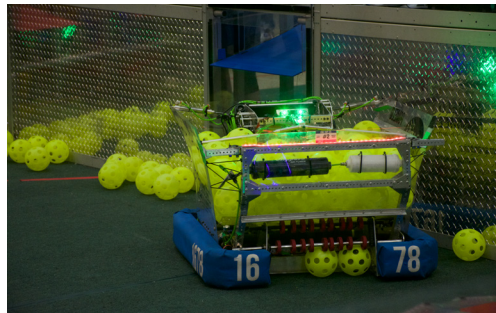

We ended up losing in the quarterfinals to the Cheesy Poofs, but not before posting one of the highest scores in the competition.
